Dr. **Rachna T. Shroff**, MD, MS, joined the faculty of the University of Arizona College of Medicine – Tucson in April 2018 as an associate professor in the Department of Medicine, Division of Hematology and Oncology, and chief of the Section of GI Medical Oncology at the UA Cancer Center. She was previously an assistant and then associate professor at the University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, where she specialized in pancreatic and biliary cancers. While on faculty, she helped build one of the largest clinical and research programs in biliary tract malignancies in the country.
